## Did you know...



Children with language disorder may have have difficulties following long instructions with many information carrying words (ICW's). An ICW is a word that carries meaning. A sentence such as: 'Pass me the big, red bag would be of 3 key words while the sentence pass me the yellow striped shirt with sleeves would be of 4 key words.

Practicing ICW's in a conversation without giving physical cues or using gesture is a good way to help your child's understanding of language.

You can practice using ICW's in activities where you give instructions.


