SMBS Pupil Premium Report 2020-21

42 pupils (73% of the school population) are eligible for Pupil Premium funding for the year 2020-21.

The projection for the academic year 2020 - 21 is funding of £42,020 (as of June 21 we have received £31,515)

We had planned to spend £52154 based on the actions outlined below with the difference coming from the general school budget. This has been the case in previous years due to the small number of pupils in the school and the way Pupil Premium payments are made incrementally throughout the year.




On average only 3% fewer pupil premium pupils have made expected progress in every subject up to term 4.

Pupil Premium Vs Non Pupil Premium Expected Progress




The next 3 graphs show change from term 4 2020 to term 4 2021 for years 8-11. First graph is the whole school, second pupil premium only, third non-PP only. There is a higher proportion of decreased (red) than previous years but this is no surprise due to the impact of the pandemic.
