INTRODUCTION

The St Marylebone CE Bridge School continues working towards achieving the 8 Gatsby Benchmarks, and will use them to plan our CEIAG (Careers, Education, Information, Advice and Guidance) programme. In line with our Church of England ethos the School works to ensure that all pupils have access to suitable education and training opportunities when they leave. As part of our commitment to informing students of the full range of employment, learning and training pathways on offer to them we are happy to consider requests from training, apprenticeship and vocational education providers. We aim to build strong partnerships between our School and different types of training providers.

This policy statement sets out the School's arrangements for managing the access of providers to students at the School for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the School's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997 and responds to the Provider Access Legislation which came into force in January 2023.

STUDENT ENTITLEMENT

All students in Years 7-11 are entitled:

- To find out about technical education qualifications, T levels and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point;
- To hear from and have meaningful encounters with a range of local technical education and apprenticeship providers about the opportunities they offer, including

technical education, work experience and apprenticeships – through assemblies, group discussions, career and post 16 fairs, workshops, personal careers guidance, Enterprise week and taster events;

 To understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.

The updated Provider Access Legislation (January 2023) specifies schools must provide at least six encounters with approved providers of apprenticeships and technical education for all their students:

- Two encounters for pupils during the 'first key phase' (Year 8 or 9) that are mandatory for all pupils to attend.
- Two encounters for pupils during the 'second key phase' (Year 10 or 11) that are mandatory for all pupils to attend.

Providers are required to send any material to be used in advance and to have a discussion with the Careers Leader or a member of their team before visiting to ensure that all content is suitable for our students. Providers may be denied access if they do not work with the School to meet the students' needs.

PREMISES AND FACILITIES

The School will make classrooms, sports hall, private meeting rooms and outdoor space available for discussions and workshops between the provider and students, as appropriate to the activity.

The School will also make available AV and other specialist equipment to support provider presentations and content. This will all be discussed and agreed in advance of the visit with the Careers Leader or a member of their team.

Providers are welcome to leave a copy of their prospectus or other relevant course literature at the School.
