## 1. Introduction

At St Marylebone CE Bridge School, we are committed to fostering an inclusive and respectful learning environment. A school uniform plays a significant role in promoting a sense of community and belonging among students. This policy outlines our expectations regarding school uniforms and provides guidance to parents and students.

## 2. Aims and Objectives

- To ensure all students wear a uniform that promotes a sense of identity and pride in the school.
- To maintain high standards of appearance, which reflect the values of our school community.
- To provide guidance on uniform requirements that are accessible and affordable for all families.
- To support an inclusive environment where individual expression is respected within the uniform framework.
- To ensure all uniform items comply with the latest DfE guidance on school uniforms.

## 3. Uniform Requirements

All students are required to wear the following items as part of their uniform:

### 3.1 Everyday Uniform

- **Shirts:** Plain white shirts or blouses.
- **Jumpers/Sweatshirts:** Green school sweatshirt or V-neck jumper with the school logo.
- **Trousers/Skirts:** Plain grey or green skirts or trousers. Shorts are permitted in the summer term, but they must be knee-length and plain grey.
- **Footwear:** Plain black shoes or plain black trainers (no logos or high tops).

### 3.2 PE Kit

- **Top:** Plain white T-shirt or polo shirt.
- **Bottom:** Plain green or black joggers.
- **Sweatshirt:** Green school PE sweatshirt with the school logo.
- **Footwear:** Plain black or white trainers (not high tops).

## 4. Optional uniform items

Families may choose to purchase other items of uniform which do not form part of the required uniform, these include:

- Green blazer
- Green tie

## 5. Ordering Uniform

Uniform items which bear the school logo can be purchased from Orchard Clothing. For more information visit [Orchard Clothing](#). We do not insist on pupils wearing items with the school logo on it and encourage families to look at economical alternatives without the logo which are available in many high street stores and large supermarkets.

## 6. Second Hand Uniform Options

The school encourages sustainability through second hand uniform sales. Families may donate gently used items, which will be available to others at no cost. Please contact the school office for details on availability.

## 7. Financial Support

We understand that uniform costs can be a burden for some families. If financial assistance is needed, parents are encouraged to speak confidentially with the Key Stage Lead or a member of the Senior Leadership Team.

## 8. Compliance with the Policy

Students are expected to adhere to the uniform policy at all times. Non-compliance may result in a discussion with parents/carers to resolve any issues. Students should wear their full PE kit only on designated PE days.

## 9. Review of the Policy

This policy will be reviewed tri-annually to ensure its effectiveness and relevance to the school community.
